Education for Lifelong Health: Diabetes Factsheet

The Florida Center for Inclusive Communities (FCIC) recognizes that good health is vital to enjoying all other life activities. People with developmental disabilities often have difficulty accessing appropriate high-quality healthcare oftentimes because health care providers lack training or familiarity with the supports people with developmental disabilities need.

FCIC is addressing this issue by undertaking activities that either a) educate health care providers to be sensitive to the special health needs of people with disabilities or b) assist individuals and their caregivers to be proactive about knowing and communicating their own health needs across their lifespan.

<u>The Education for Lifelong Health: Diabetes Factsheet</u> is part of a series of health factsheets developed for people with mild intellectual disabilities. The Diabetes Factsheet provides information on types of diabetes and symptoms, diagnosing diabetes, diabetes treatment, and strategies for staying healthy with diabetes.
