Education for Lifelong Health: Cancer Treatment Factsheet

The <u>Florida Center for Inclusive Communities (FCIC)</u> recognizes that good health is vital to enjoy all other life activities. People with developmental disabilities often have difficulty accessing appropriate high-quality healthcare oftentimes because healthcare providers lack training or familiarity with the supports people with developmental disabilities need.

FCIC is addressing this issue by undertaking activities that either a) educate health care providers to be sensitive to the special health needs of people with disabilities or b) assist individuals and their caregivers to be proactive about knowing and communicating their own health needs across their lifespan.

The Education for Lifelong Health: Cancer Treatment Factsheet is part of a series of five health factsheets developed for people with mild intellectual disability. The Cancer Treatment Factsheet provides information on diagnosing cancer and various cancer treatments including radiation, chemotherapy, and surgery.
