The nonprofit Access Independence (AI), a Center for Independent Living, provides four basic core services to persons with disabilities: peer mentoring, independent living skills training, information and referral and advocacy. Other services include accessibility services, Medicaid Waiver services, community education

Support groups are organized for individuals with disabilities who share common concerns.
